Modified School Year Calendar – Ad Hoc Committee Report

In February, Trustees approved the creation of an ad hoc committee to explore the option of a balanced school year calendar that would begin in August, rather than September. There are many benefits to a balanced school year calendar, including: reduction in summer learning loss, increased time on task, reduced stress, reduced absenteeism, and improved student achievement. Some of the challenges with a balanced school year calendar include: weather (summer



heat in August), professional development for staff, sports scheduling, modified report cards, change in tradition and staffing considerations.

Through their work, the ad hoc committee explored the benefits and challenges of a balanced school year calendar. In their report to Trustees on Monday night, the committee recommended the establishment of a pilot elementary school in Brantford with a balanced year calendar. Following discussion of the report, Trustees agreed with the committee's findings and recommended for approval the establishment of a working group to manage the logistics of creating the pilot for the 2022-23 school year.

This report supports the Well-being indicator of <u>Grand Erie's Multi-Year Plan</u> and *Success for Every Student* through the following statement: "We will create environments that are healthy and that recognize the well-being of mind, body, emotion and spirit of students and staff. Trustee Replacement Process

On October 1, 2020, Trustee Christina Speers (County of Brant and Norfolk County – Wards 3 &7) resigned. The resignation results in a trustee vacancy for Grand Erie. The Board has two options to replace the vacancy: by-election or the appointment of a qualified person. In appointing a qualified person, the Board has two options: select the third runner-up from the 2018 election or advertise the vacant trustee position and request qualified individuals declare an interest.

Following discussion of the report, Trustees directed the secretary of the board (Director of Education, JoAnna Roberto) to move forward with filling the vacancy by requesting qualified individuals to declare their interest. At the October 26, 2020 Board Meeting, a schedule of the process and timelines moving forward will be presented to the Board by Roberto.
