he Native Club had a very successful luncheon to conclude this year and will continue in the new term.


Business Leadership

Co-Operative Education is a fabulous opportunity for students to earn credits towar their high school diploma and to explore, first hand, a career that they may be considering. A wide variety of placements are available including: automotive, radio broadcasting, machining, veterinary services, nursing, business administration, law, hairstyling, etc... After working in their chosen field for one semester, many students take steps to continue towards this career while others find out that perhaps this career is not something they wish to pursue Students can participate in a 2, 3 or 4 credit Coop experience and they may use up to 2 Coop credits as a compulsory credits.
