Welcome to Grade 1/2

My name is Mrs. Patricia Sawdyk Coverdale and I am so thrilled to be teaching your child this year. It's going to be an incredible year. Here's a little about me, just so you know who your child is spending their days with. I have two children, Alex who is 9 and Annie, who is 5. They are the joys of my life and keep me on my toes between rep baseball and dance and music and swimming etc etc... We spent time at the family cottage this year, which is my favorite place in the world (Algonquin Park area) and is one of the best places for children to learn and grow. Our family loves to fish, boat, ski, tube and always a morning swim to start the day.

I am committed to providing your child with the best academic experience possible this year. I will be conducting lots of small group instruction to help meet children's needs and to explore various areas of inquiry and interest for the children. It's also really important that each child feels special, loved and heard. They need to feel safe and happy at school and that's my ultimate goal. I am very passionate about my job and feel blessed to have the opportunity to do this every day.

The curriculum this month will be focused on academics and community building and character education. We will also be exploring the Zones of Regulation (google it if you have chance, it's fantastic for parents). I will be conducting diagnostic assessments on each child to see where they are at in reading, writing and math. In addition to speaking with last year's teachers, it would be helpful to me if you could fill in the survey I am sending home with this. You can indicate areas of need and development while also telling me about your child's interests, hobbies etc to help guide my planning for the year.

We will begin weekly spelling and word study activities in the 2nd or 3rd week. There will be a spelling test each Monday and then new words assigned after that. That way you have the weekend to help your child study and feel prepared. You will see other assessments coming home throughout the year, some will be tests, some will be students demonstrating their learning with hands on activities inside the classroom. Things like journals and writing folders stay here until the end of the year so we can map our progress, so don't be alarmed if you don't always see writing samples coming home. We will display them during open houses and interviews etc for parents to see.

The main homework component is the Home Reading Program. It wont take much time at all if you can commit to a few minutes each night to read with your child. I will be looking for volunteers to come and help us out with this in October. If you're interested, please let me know and complete a police check and have it on file at the office. Thanks so much. Volunteers are soo important to our programming and we are always very grateful.

We will begin with some basic counting, number skills and a patterning unit in math and will be starting science and social studies in a couple weeks. I am committed to making this a wonderful year for your child and look forward to learning and growing together!
