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Language & The Arts

This month in language, we will be studying the text features found within fiction texts and using these features to form book summaries. We will also begin to look at non-fiction text features and participate in a mini poetry unit. Spelling tests will continue throughout this month. In music, we will be learning all about the instruments found within an orchestra with a focus on classical and baroque music. Early in October, we will be creating a cute Autumn craft so please send in a clean (no labels please), pint sized (medium) mason jar with your child. Note: the lid is not necessary, but it can be helpful for labelling your child's jar.

Mathematics

After our unit test on Patterning (increasing and decreasing sequences /ttables and repeating patterns), we will begin Number Sense & Numeration. A focus for both grades during this unit will be developing an understanding of place value (ones, tens, hundreds, thousands, ten thousands, hundred thousands, etc.), how to write numbers in words, expanded form, & with base ten blocks, adding/subtracting multi-digit numbers, basic multiplication (we will also continue our Mad Minute Monday challenge), and more. Feel free to ask your child to bring his/her math duotang/folder/workbook home on weekends to review.

Science & Social Studies

The grade 4's will continue to enjoy time with the other grade fours and Mrs. Wilson in their study on habitats, and the grade 5's will continue working with myself on the unit: Human Body Systems. In Social Studies, the grade 4's will begin to learn
