Winter Dressing

Cooler weather will be here before we know it. Encourage your child to become an independent dresser. Dressing for recess and home is a challenging task. Winter coats and boots can be difficult to put on, so here are a few tips to help your child be successful with winter dressing.

- Consider coats and boots without removable liners. These liners often come out and are difficult for students to put back in.
- Start practicing now. Encourage your child to put on their boots and coats independently so they will be ready when the cold weather arrives. Make it a game, dress to the beat of music (fast or slow), or even a race that they can win!
- Also, it is a good idea to send in cooler weather clothes to put in their extra clothes bag.

Extra Shoes

Students do not have indoor and outdoor shoes and don't change shoes throughout the day, but if you may want your child to have an extra pair of shoes at school in case they wear rainboots and forget to bring shoes.

Fine Motor Skills

Improvement of fine motor skills through play makes it possible for children to succeed with their writing tasks in the classroom. Give your child the opportunity to develop their fine motor skills every day by building with small blocks, "sewing" using a shoelace or string through holes punched into cardboard along the edges, and by using play dough or clay. Strong fine motor skills are also important for using scissors successfully. Give your child ample opportunity to practice using scissors to cut along lines and curves drawn on paper or to cut out pictures, letters or shapes found in old newspapers or magazines. Show your child how to keep his/her thumb on top when cutting while the other hand holds and turns the paper.

Names

JK Students are working hard to learn how to print their names. Keep up the good work and remember to learn how to form letters correctly. Once learned the wrong way it is difficult to change habits. Correct letter formation will help students be more efficient as they develop their writing skills.
