# Halloween Parade

**October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2019** Students are encouraged to dress up for the Halloween Parade through the school.

## What's been happening?

During the month of September, the students have started doing writing tasks in relation to the read aloud that we are currently on. The book we chose was Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. The students have started creating profiles for the characters, inquiring about the different parts of the book and how they as a classroom community can work to see the moral of the story. To add to this theme, the students have been using their place value skills in order to develop their own chocolate factories. Students have looked at the different forms a number can be represented, built inventory for the candy factories and also developed a deeper understanding of the importance of mathematics when running a 'business'.

Through science, students have been learning about the different part of a plant and how plants and nature positively affects the world around us. Students have started to recognize that many of our day-to-day items come from different parts of plants. Students have started to take observations and develop inquiry-based questions about other factors within plant and the environment.

Within the month of September, Art was specifically designated to Terry Fox and creating artistic pieces with inspirational quotes and sayings on them. Students were extremely successful and providing positive messages around the school. These will be sent home the second week of October.
