I just finished writing our Progress Reports. I am a pretty proud teacher – we have had some pretty steady growth made so far this year! I can't wait to talk to you about it at our upcoming Interviews.

Here are a few reminders (and my opinions) about Progress Reports:

- 1. EVERYONE has made PROGRESS!!! I just (unfortunately) had to sort students into Progressing Very Well, Progressing Well and Progressing with Difficulty.
- 2. If your child has earned a Progressing Well.....it covers A LOT of ground. By the time Report Cards come along they could be earning an 'A', 'B' or 'C'. (I'll talk more about the grades in January or.....please ask me at your child's interview! One tip: Our goal for the year is a letter grade 'B'. That means your child is meeting Province-Wide Expectations. A 'C' means that they are pretty close!)
- 3. If your child has earned a Progressing with Difficulty.....I want to promise you that the word <u>Progressing is STILL in there</u>!!!! There has still been growth!!!! There may just be a lot of help from the teacher involved or maybe they just need a bit more time to reach the milestones for each month.
- 4. A LOT of PEOPLE want the 3:30 & 6:00 time slot for an interview on the Thursday. (And I have not cloned myself yet. ③) If you are not happy with the interview time that comes home please drop me a note. I'm pretty flexible. I can usually meet right after school or even before school the week following Interview Night.
- 5. I am a truth teller. I have to be. You would hate me if your child was struggling with something big when they got to Grade 3 and I didn't tell you about it when it was happening in Grade 1. I try to be gentle and I'm always here to support everyone.
