Welcome back!

After being away for a long time we are very excited to be back at Ryerson Heights.

To start the year there will be many changes to our daily operating procedures. Most of these can be found in the Ryerson Heights Day at Glance and the Board's Reopening plan. Although we are confident that our return to school will be successful we do expect an adjustment period for both staff and students as we work towards our new normal.

Below are a few highlights from both of the previously mentioned documents.

- Staff, students and any visitors must complete daily Covid-19 screening before coming to school.
- Students and siblings must stay home if anyone in the household is exhibiting Covid-19 symptoms.
- The parking lot will be closed at arrival and dismissal time.

- Only parents of Kindergarten parents are allowed on the yard at arrival and dismissal times.
- Students will be staying inside ple during nutrition break time and the traditional recess time in order to prevent the mixing of cohorts and the number of students entering and exiting the building.

Future Opt In/Out Dates

This year all families had the option of choosing between face to face instruction or online instruction.

At three points in the year families will be able to switch from one option to the other.

October 13th, 2020 January 4th, 2021 March 22nd, 2021 We will share the procedure for making that change once the School Board informs us how to proceed.

Please know that if a significant number of students return to Ryerson both our class sizes and possibly the number of classes will change.

At Ryerson we are fortunate that most of our classes have been

kept small (under 20) with only a few just over that number. Smaller classes will allow us greater flexibility and the ability to manage social distancing. In part this was achieved because a large number of our families selected the online learning option.

Nutrition Breaks


All Grand Erie Elementary Schools are on a **Balanced School Day.** This means that your child will have two nutrition breaks during the day. Students are to remain at school during the first break but may go **home** during the afternoon break (gr. 6 and up). Please remind younger students to save food for both breaks.

Please note that there are several students at Ryerson Heights with anaphylactic allergies to: peanuts, tree nuts, sesame, latex, kiwi, guava fruit and mango. In some cases, just exposure to these items could trigger a lifethreatening reaction.

We appreciate the cooperation of all families in keeping the items out of the school. We ask for your support by voluntarily avoiding...

Nuts and sesame in any form (including nut butters, nut oils or any items baked with nut products), latex products, kiwi, guava fruit or mango. Nut substitutes like WowButter or other nut substitutes should also not be sent to school.

Since students will be inside during regular nutrition break times this year please consider sending an independent activity they can do at their desks.
