## **Arrival Routines**

With the safety concerns that Covid 19 present, we are doing things differently at Bloomsburg P. S. this year. We are making every effort to keep students safely distanced from each other at school. This includes on the yard as well as in the hallways and in the classrooms.

When students arrive at school on the bus, they will get off the buses and walk, distancing themselves to their specific area on the school yard. Walkers should go directly to their classroom cohort area. Parents who are walking their child to the "dumpster line" for drop-off will need to ensure they are maintaining 2 metre physical distance from staff and other parents/students and wearing a mask. Non-bused students should arrive between 8:35-8:45am.

\*\*On your child's first day, all staff will be outside helping your child find their teacher.

## **Dismissal Routines**



Students will be dismissed at 3:05 p.m. For students who do not ride the bus, students will be exiting via the east doors. Parents of "pick- ups" can wait at the "dumpster line" and staff of primary students will ensure pick up directly to parents. Please

be prompt. But also, please be patient as this may take a little extra time while staff learn to recognize you with a mask on. Please don't be offended if we ask for ID if staff are unsure of who you are – we are simply trying to ensure our students' safety. Remember not to park in the bus driveways or staff parking lot. **Parents are reminded about maintaining social distancing and wearing a mask when they pick up their children.** Walkers <u>must</u> leave at dismissal time.

### **New Procedure**

Our primary focus is to ensure the safety of staff and children attending. Additional health and safety precautions have been put in place to minimize the risk of COVID-19 while participating at school. In order to provide the highest level of care and safety, Bloomsburg will follow guidelines set out by our Health and Safety Committee and the local Health Unit. We ask that you thoroughly read and strictly adhere to these guidelines to assist us in minimizing risks.

In order to minimize physical contact between children and staff and encourage physical distancing, it is imperative that your child is responsible enough to strictly adhere to the guidelines outlined below when attending school. We ask that parents discuss these guidelines with their child prior to attending to help them understand

what COVID is, why it is important to follow these guidelines, and to help prepare them for school.

#### Screening

Parents will be expected to screen their child daily prior to attending school. Is/has your child or anyone in your family:

1.Showing signs or symptoms of respiratory infection, such as cough, shortness of breath, or sore throat?

2.Experiencing a fever with a temperature of 38C or higher, or taken any fever reducing medications in the last 12 hours?

3. Experiencing any flu-like symptoms including diarrhea in the last 24 hours?

4. Travelled outside of Canada in the last 14 days?

5.Been in contact with anyone that has displayed symptoms of COVID-19 in the last 14 days?

Student are not to come to school if they are experiencing any of the above symptoms and or do not pass the online COVID screening. (https://covid-19.ontario.ca/self-assessment/)

### **PERSONAL ITEMS AT SCHOOL**

Students are reminded that we discourage bringing personal items to school that have personal or monetary value. Particularly during this time, we discourage any extra possessions being brought to school. Students will be keeping all of their belongings at their desks/tables so we need to have only the minimum required brought to school.

#### **Attendance**

Please advise the school by 9:00 a.m. if your child will be late or absent. Phone messages can be left at any time, day or night, at **519-426-0942**.

Students who are late arriving will need be buzzed in the main doors, use hand sanitizer (while supervised) and a staff member will escort young students to their class. Parents can verbally "sign them in" when they buzz the door.

#### School closed to non-essential persons

At this time parents/guardians, volunteers and non-essential persons are not able to enter our school. If you need to pick up your child early, please call the school office. We will have your child waiting for you at the front doors. Please call to let us know you are here. If you do not have a cell phone, please use the buzzer at the main doors to let Mrs. Hyde-Dawson know you are here. We will dismiss your child out the front doors. Students will use hand sanitizer prior to leaving.

It's important for parents to review their plans to make sure they have the necessary coverage for high-risk activities. Parents may want to consider purchasing additional personal coverage to reduce the anxiety associated from an injury to their child.

Please be aware that we have students and staff with allergies and/or sensitivities to peanuts and scents. We very much appreciate your cooperation with these policies.
