# Leading and Learning in a Pandemic

Director of Education JoAnna Roberto welcomed Trustees and senior administration back for the first meeting kicking off the 2021-22 school year. The start of this year also marks the launch of Grand Erie's new multi-year strategic plan. This summer, the school board approved the new strategic direction to guide its work in the coming years. At the core of the plan is the vision to Learn, Lead, Inspire, and a mission to build a culture of Learning, Well-Being and Belonging to inspire each learner.

## **Major Construction Update**

The childcare projects at both Hagersville Secondary School and Central Public School are now complete. The construction at Central Public School in Brantford created an addition allowing for childcare space for 10 infants, 15 toddlers, 24 preschoolers, and space to provide support for families. The project at Hagersville Secondary School renovated the existing childcare space and will service 10 infants, 15 toddlers, and 24 preschoolers. Final financial information will be provided through the Final Major Construction report presented to Trustees in September.

#### **Summer Learning Success**

This summer, more than 200 Grand Erie students participated in Camp SAIL. Open to students entering grades 3-5, this Summer Adventures in Learning program provides students with an opportunity to continue developing literacy and numeracy skills in the summer months, with a fun summer camp-like experience. Students and teachers also had opportunity to work with Apple Education this year to connect literacy, numeracy, and technology through three programs: Digital Artisans, Digital Creations, and Digital Storytelling.

Summer learning for secondary students included 1407 registrations in eLearning courses and 480 registrations in online learning courses. In addition, 170 students participated in Reach Ahead credits, 87 students in credit recovery and 23 students in course upgrades.

Students and teachers received support this year through Learning Resource Teachers and Multilingual Learning Resource Teachers. We would like to extend our appreciation to Camp SAIL administrators Alison Cooke, Nancy Norton and Cheryl Bannister, Program Coordinator Brenda Stone and the many educators for their dedication and exemplary leadership which led to the success of this program. Thank you to Superintendents Lisa Munro, April Smith and Liana Thompson, who led the Summer Learning programing and initiatives.
