Annual Operating and Learning Plans

Grand Erie's Senior Administration team presented its Annual Operating and Learning Plans to the Board on Monday. These plans guide their work and the work of the system, and address components of the new Grand Erie Multi-Year Plan. The plan outlines and includes Year 1 goals for learning in the areas of literacy, mathematics, graduation, well-being and belonging that represent the Board Improvement Plan.

Additionally, operational items are included such as Human Resources, Finance and Facilities, Information Technology, Leadership and Communication. The plan is bold and new, concise and aligned with measurable goals. It is flexible and responsive to system needs, and ensures that this work is leveraged across the organization so everyone is part of the process and plan. Orange Shirt Day: September 30, 2021

Orange Shirt Day provides an opportunity for all people in Canada to engage in discussions or provide acknowledgement and support in addressing the brutal legacy of the residential school system.

National Day for Truth and Reconciliation Day: September 30, 2021

In Canada, September 30, 2021 marks the first National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

The day honours the lost Indigenous children and residential school survivors, their families and communities. Public commemoration of this tragic and painful history, and the ongoing impacts of residential schools, is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

September 30 is an opportunity for everyone to learn about Truth and Reconciliation.





The creation of this federal statutory holiday was through legislative amendments made by Parliament. On June 3, 2021, Bill C-5, An Act to amend the Bills of Exchange Act, the Interpretation Act and the Canada Labour Code (National Day for Truth and Reconciliation) received Royal Assent.

Leading and Learning in the Pandemic
