Major Construction Update

In October 2020, the Ministry of Education provided the Board with approved funding to address the enrolment pressure in Southwest Brantford by constructing a new 650-pupil elementary school. The general scope of the project is to partner with both the City of Brantford and the Brantford Public Library to construct a joint-use elementary school that would include an enhanced library, a triple gymnasium, and a 4-room child-care centre at the undeveloped site near the intersection of Shellard Lane and Anderson Road in Brantford.

Director's Report Highlights

A Successful Summer of Learning, Leading and Inspiring

This summer saw the successful return of in-person learning and wellbeing opportunities for students and staff. Among the highlights:

- Grand Erie's first Summer Institute, providing learning and professional development opportunities for staff, ran from August 17 – 24, with 17 sessions running, in-person and virtually, and approximately 150 participants.
- Camp SAIL (Summer Adventures in Learning) returned inperson at six locations across Grand Erie and saw double the number of students taking part in the learning.
- Three new technology camps were offered at various secondary-school sites in July and August including Mind Over Metal, Organized KOAS and Cooking with Chef David Wolfman.
- Grand Erie ran a drop-in support site at JC Hill in Ohsweken in July to allow students enrolled in online courses to receive in-person supports.
- Summer Learning courses saw 2,253 credits (and counting) earned by Grand Erie students looking to get caught up, get ahead or explore a new subject.

Action Plan for 2022-23

Director Roberto shared a glimpse into the Learning in Action Plan for the upcoming school year. Among the highlights:

- Specialized Services will focus on inclusive education working closely with the K-12 Program team.
- The K-12 Program team will continue to focus on culturally relevant, responsive and sustainable pedagogy, the implementation of a Reading Assessment Portfolio and Responsive Instruction.
- The Math journey continues with Instructional Coaches for All, as well as De-streaming and Re-engagement.
- AQ courses will continue to be offered to staff throughout the year at no cost to educators.
- Indigenous Education continues to focus on culture-competency training and intentional supports at the elementary level.
- The Equity Action Plan and the Mental Health Strategy are underway.
- Leadership Pathways will be offered to staff across the district.
