Hallowe'en

Some classes may participate in Hallowe'en activities on October 31. Teachers will share plans for their class. A reminder that any treats sent to school must be nut free. In



addition, the Brant County Health Unit requires all food served in a school be prepared in either a commercial or health unit inspected kitchen. We are not permitted to share items that are baked/prepared at home.

Costumes: Students must avoid using identities and cultures as costumes. This includes appropriative costumes/cultural stereotypes (i.e., cultural garments), black/brown face, transphobic costumes (i.e., man dressed as a woman), body-shaming and objectifying costumes, and costumes that joke about situations that have caused harm (i.e., COVID pandemic). Such costumes perpetuate stereotypes and can cause harm that can further marginalize and oppress community members. As an alternative to a costume, students may also wear orange and black.

<u>Parade:</u> We will have the traditional parade through the school and around the playground. Families will be able to watch from outside the fence line (weather permitting). In the event of inclement weather, we will only do the inside parade and will not be able to accommodate viewing for families. Details regarding timeframe will be shared closer to the date.



Coin de l'immersion/Immersion Corner

Learning in and Early Immersion Program:

Just as reading in one's mother tongue depends on the ability to understand and to use that language orally, so must immersion students first develop a basic knowledge of French. In the beginning years, there is a strong emphasis on developing oral language skills (understanding of oral French, which will lead to production or speaking some French).

As students develop and strengthen their oral language skills, they will be able to apply these to reading and writing. Even if you do not speak, read, or write French, you can still support your child at home. Here are some basic phonics comparisons between English and French:

- -most consonants have the same sound in English and French
- -vowel sounds differ significantly between English and French

- -h is always silent in French
- -an s at the end of a plural word in French is silent
- -qu sounds like K (and not kw as in English)
- -th is pronounced t
- -ch is pronounced like English sh
- -I is pronounced like long e in English (as in bee)
- -y sounds like yes, even at the end of a word
- -eau and au have the same long o sound
- -accents change the sounds of vowels

As you support your child in developing their abilities as a reader, you might consider talking about the similarities and differences in the languages. The ability to identify similarities and differences between sounds and the sequence of sounds within a word is an important skill in learning to read and write.

Head Lice

Parents are asked to check their child's head regularly in order to keep head lice under control. The Grand Erie District School Board recognizes pediculosis is not a health or education issue but is a community concern and a social nuisance. Pediculosis needs to be managed in the best interest of students through the partnership of parent(s)/guardian(s), students and the school community. The treatment and eradication of head lice is ultimately the parent(s)/guardian(s)' responsibility. "Students diagnosed with live head lice do not need to be sent home early from school; they can go home at the end of the day, be treated, and return to class after appropriate treatment has begun. When a case of headlice is detected in our school, we will follow the procedures outlined in SO101:

This procedure includes a checklist that families must complete and return to school whenever a case of headlice has been identified.
