Principal Report: Andrea Smith

- Fall sports are continuing;
 - Cross country meet today intermediate boys and girls placed second overall
 - o Soccer tournaments (co-ed junior and intermediate) with the tournament next week
 - o volleyball will be the next sport
- Clubs chess and ukulele (beginner and experienced) are underway;
- Mural Project community representation on the walking bridge organized by Mme. Coretti;
- Snack Program October 20th is Crunch Day (apples for all!) with a fundraising endeavour for school Cash Online (asking for about \$1-\$2 each);
- Bus Evacuation next week bus patrollers support the safe procedures of bus evacuation;
- Trips Brantwood Farms and the Safety Village are in the works for primary;
- October 28th School Photo Retake Day;
- Dufferin shared in their first school-wide assembly Learn, Lead, Inspire (certificates and bulletin board to recognize students);
- School-wide BINGO on Teams continues working on numbers in French as a school (which is a fun challenge because math instruction is in English);
- Staff Learning PA Day on Friday
 - Learning on human trafficking, grooming, and targeting how to watch for these signs and support students;
 - Equity and Inclusion with a focus on special education accessibility to curriculum;
 - School data collection for the School Improvement Plan (mathematics instruction and divisional group planning);
- Instructional strategies and intervention offered to primary educators next week with the Right
 to Read document to help guide (Dufferin will be moving forward in using the French Consultant
 to link French language/reading instruction);
- November Dufferin will participate in student census with Grade 4-8
 - o designed by the Safe and Inclusive Schools Department;
 - it will ask how students feel safe, representation of self, representation of marginalized students, etc.

- o consent forms will be coming home soon;
- o the data is important to guide the school planning and ensures student voices are heard;
- Progress Reports will be coming home the first week of November;
 - Parent Teacher Interviews will be the following week, along with an in-person Book Fair
- School-wide fundraiser with Purdy's Chocolate direct ordering from website, sorting and pickup to happen at school
 - o Gord: Is this fundraiser for a specific cause?
 - Andrea: Bursary for trips, rejuvenating the LLC/Makerspace (board grant will require funds to be raised in order to qualify)
- Grade 7/8 Fundraiser will be an individual chocolate bar sale Lamontagne Chocolate (Lansdowne will be doing the same fundraiser)
- School yoga follow-up from last meeting
 - Andrea: Is Bhava Tree still running? Action: Monika to inquire
- CPIP Grant is due in November 21st schools are asked to put in a proposal for a facility upgrade/extras, put in \$10,000, the board puts in \$10,000 and then you move forward
 - o Talked about the stereo system and the projector as our main focus project
 - Andrea has looked into quotes (FM Audio) however we'd like to have around 3 quotes to compare;
 - Stereo system quote (installation and equipment): \$14,170.19
 - Projection System Quote (installation and equipment, rear projector mounting and screen): \$36, 883.19
 - Suggestion: try a quote with Long & McQuade
 - Action: Andrea to work to generate a few more quotes
 - Kindershed is also in the works (estimated at about \$10,000)
 - Proposing having both the projection sound system and kindergarten shed together for the CPIP Grant
- Gord: Motion for the application for the CPIP Grant to have the PA System (quoted at \$14, 170.19) and Kindershed (estimated cost \$10,000) included, seconded by Monika, virtual vote with 4 voting members in favour;
- Open floor discussion in understanding the combined projects, new motion proposed;
- Motion to submit the CPIP Grant application to include the PA system with the current quote of \$14,170.19 and the kindershed, with an estimated cost of \$10,000, with the option to consider either/or if total funds are not available, Monika seconded, motion passed with 9 votes
- Andrea: Pizza Days
 - There is a ton of extra (8 full pizzas today)
 - o Did cross country today contribute to this? Are we ordering too much?
 - o What is the process for when there are students away due to illness or sporting events?
 - Sports we can save it for the students
 - Individual absences it is too challenging to save the pizza? Could we create a disclaimer that it automatically goes to a sibling? Or is donated?
 - Staff requires a policy and procedure for if this happens in the future
 - Mme. Smith has received a request for a refund, Monika has suggested that we offer pizza at the next pizza day and moving forward, provide pizza for students who are at a tournament

 Conclusion – if able, we will deliver pizza to sporting events if they coincide with pizza day (parent spectator and/or when the students return from the sporting event if it aligns with the school day). For individual absences, unless parents call with specific instructions, the pizza will be donated.
