## **School Council Tip Sheet**





Use this handy checklist to review your current parent/caregiver engagement activities, and to stimulate discussion and ideas for future activities and events.

☐ Have we used surveys and other information-gathering tools to assess what parents/

caregivers need and want, and to ask for their opinions and suggestions?
Have we determined the barriers which may impede some parents/caregivers from participating?
How do we create an inclusive environment?
Have we explicitly invited parents/caregivers to volunteer in a variety of school activities?
Do we know which of our communications parents/caregivers are using, and what forms of communication they would like more of?
Do we have an organized plan for parent/caregiver engagement activities this year?
Do we know who has assumed responsibility for each activity within the plan?
Do we respond immediately when parents/caregivers indicate a willingness to volunteer or participate in other ways?
Do we have a school information package for newcomers?
Do we have an organized method for meeting and welcoming new families?
Have we successfully addressed barriers to parent/caregiver participation such as childcare, transportation, language services and off-site/off-hours events and programs for those who cannot attend regular events?
Do we regularly provide school events that showcase student work and activities, address issues of concern, and provide information of interest to parents/caregivers?
Do we occasionally involve the community in the life of the school through such events as career and community fairs?
Do we provide parents/caregivers with the information they need to work effectively with school staff, and that helps them support their children at home?
Do we celebrate our multicultural community by offering events that feature varied traditions, customs and sports?
Do we prominently display information about parent/caregiver groups in a high visibility area of the school?
Do we ensure that the parent/caregiver group has a presence at all school events?
Do we send frequent reminders to parents/caregivers to ensure that school and group events remain highly visible and top of mind?
Do we participate as guest speakers wherever possible in the community, outside of school?
Do we recognize the efforts of parents/caregivers and community members to encourage greater involvement and participation?
