Learn Lead Inspire Award Presentation Imam Abu Noman Tarek

Grand Erie's relationship with Imam Abu Noman Tarek began during a very difficult time. It was the aftermath of the Quebec City mosque shooting in 2017, and Imam Tarek reached out to express concern for the safety and well-being of local Muslim youth and their families. He provided invaluable guidance to Grand Erie staff to help bridge knowledge and understanding as our communities united to support learners, and worked together to take a stand against Islamophobia. In the ensuing years, Imam Tarek has become a great friend and partner to Grand Erie, providing leadership, advocacy and

opportunities, and through sharing his wisdom and experience to advance safe and inclusive environments. This year, the program is expanding to additional schools including King George, Woodman, Greenbrier, Port Rowan, West Lynn, Thompson Creek, Oneida and Mt. Pleasant, with Bellview, Cobblestone, Jarvis and Delhi returning for a second year.
