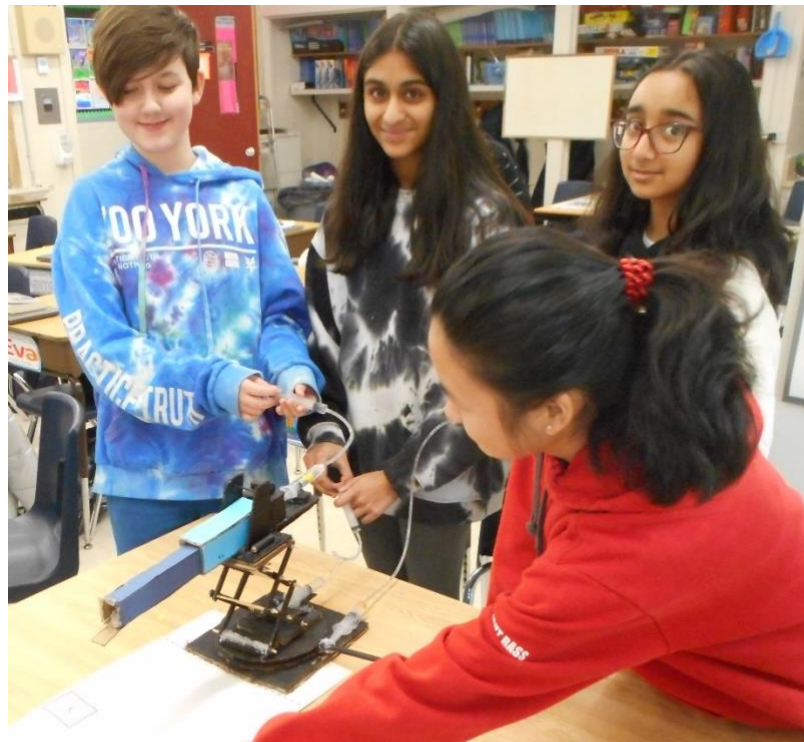
Junk Drawer Races

1st Place Winners

Eva A, Aarna A, Addie S, and Owyn N, from Glen Morris Central Public School achieved 1st place in the Southern Ontario Regional Hydraulic Crane Challenge.

The students were required to design and build a Hydraulic Crane. The crane was to be made from paper products, either toothpicks or wood skewers, fluids, syringes, and plastic tubes/pipes. Once the cranes were built, the teams were to test them out. Students were required to test their cranes to see if they could lift a load of up to 25 grams from Pickup Point 1, drop it at Drop Point 1/Pickup Point 2, lift it again, and finally drop it at Drop Point 2 in the shortest possible time. The gold winners were able to do this working together in 1.85 seconds.

These dedicated students were competing against elementary students across ten school boards in the Southern Ontario regional division. This group of students now moves on to the Provincial Championship.

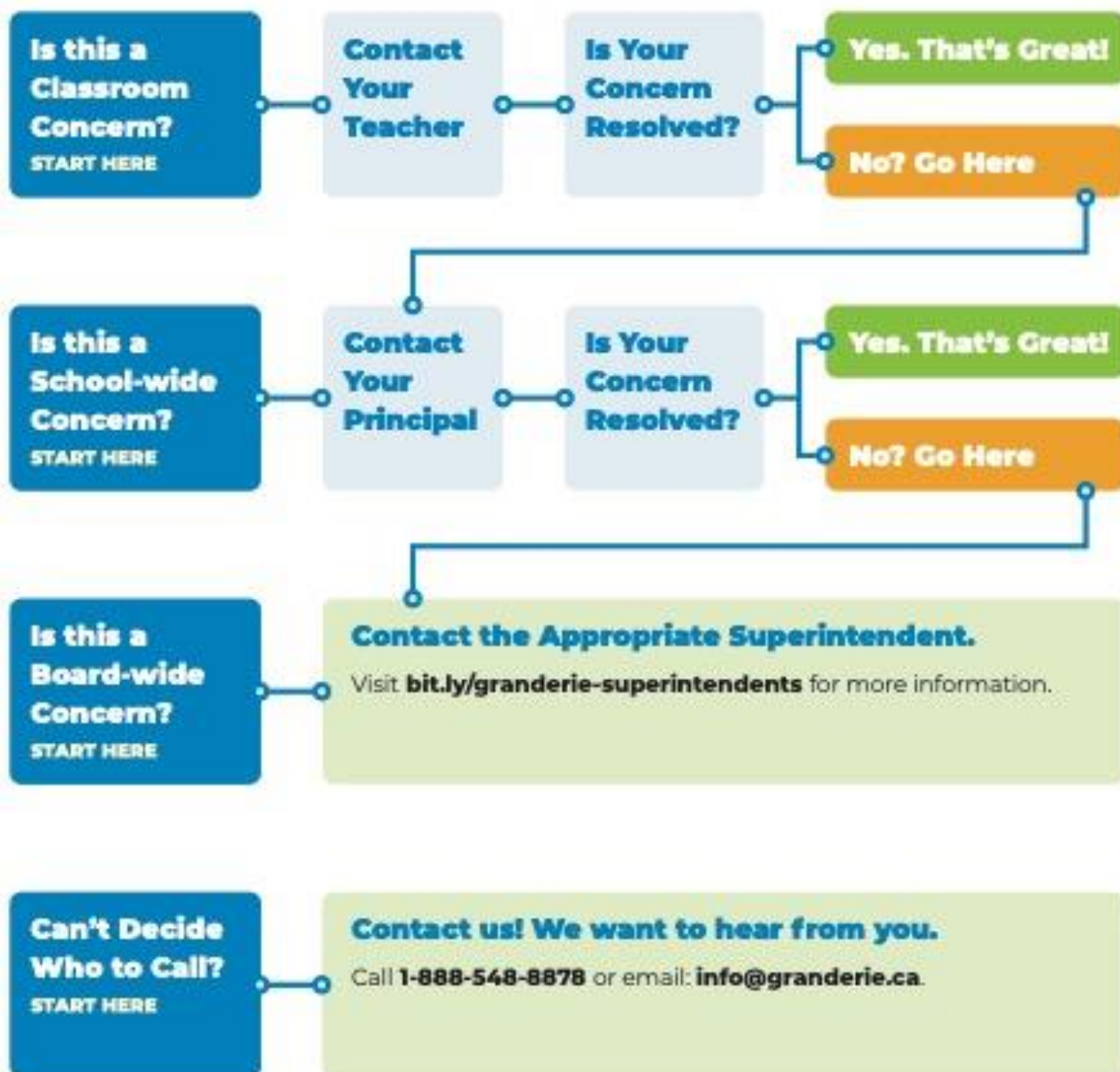


Parent/Caregiver/ Community Member Concern Chart
