Student Showcase: Putting the *Kind* in Kindergarten at St. George-German School

Inspired by the concept of the 'kindness boomerang' where one thoughtful action can set off a chain reaction of positivity, learners in educators Christine Sellar's and Shannon Wood's Kindergarten classroom at St. George-German School decided to launch an experiment. This February, students brainstormed ways to spread kindness throughout their community. The result was the Kindness Project.

The ideas they put into action included helping neighbours clear snow from walkways, bringing coffee to workers at a local animal hospital, and baking muffins to share with inspiring coaches, community volunteers and firefighters. Putting the *kind* in Kindergarten gained momentum, and spread throughout the school and the wider community, motivating others to do the same.

Director's Report Highlights Additional Qualification Courses

With a renewed focus on teaching and learning, Grand Erie is once again highlighting Additional Qualification course offerings, open to all educators including new teachers. Through partnerships with various post-secondary organizations including Queen's University, Lakehead University, Wilfrid Laurier University and Six Nations Polytechnic, Grand Erie has been able to present additional learning opportunities. This spring, through partnering with Lakehead and Queen's, several options will be available, with many Grand Erie staff members facilitating courses to enable strong, relevant connections to content.









New Ontario Secondary School Diploma Graduation Requirement

The Ministry of Education is introducing a new Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) graduation requirement for students to earn a Grade 9 or 10 Technological Education credit, starting with the cohort of students entering Grade 9 in September 2024. Students will be required to earn at least one credit from the Grade 9 or 10



courses in the Technological Education curriculum, which covers a broad range of sectors, including construction, transportation, manufacturing, computer technology, and communication. A compulsory credit in Technological Education is intended to give students hands-on experience and early exposure to skilled trades and build on the learning in the recently revised elementary Science and Technology curriculum.
