Approval of Fundraising Viability Plan for Paris District High School Track

A fundraising viability plan to redevelop the track at Paris District High School was approved Monday, with a goal of establishing the school as a community hub for recreation, while offering a modern facility that reflects the true potential of academic and athletic use at the school. The current four-lane track is not an ideal surface, and requires special maintenance, and has a limited range of uses. The new concept envisions a redeveloped track and



amenities, including widening the track to a six-lane synthetic surface that conforms to International Amateur Athletic Federation standards, conversion of the current athletic field into artificial turf, a new scoreboard, lighting and other athletic components. The project is set to cost an estimated \$3 million, and the fundraising viability plan would contribute \$2 million. Construction would begin in July 2024. Students and Staff Learning, Leading and Inspiring

Pleasant Public School, Pauline Johnson Collegiate and Vocational School, Waterford District High School, and Tollgate Technological Skills Centre represented our region with impressive placements in categories including construction, video production, LEGO mechanical engineering and robotics, restaurant services, baking, and brick masonry.
