Review of Police Programs in Schools

Grand Erie has completed an evidence-based review of police programs in schools based on curriculum, and through a human rights equity lens. The review was grounded in the Ontario Human Rights Code, valuing diverse perspectives of stakeholders and partners with the intended outcome to capture experiences and perceptions, and to make recommendations to provide positive programing updates. As a result of the review, police programs in schools will continue, with some changes, enhancements and new program offerings. Visits to schools will be planned and the purpose communicated, with presentations and programs aligned with Ontario curriculum expectations.



Operating and Capital Budgets Approved for 2023-24 School Year

Balanced operating and capital budgets for the 2023-24 school year were approved on Monday. Both budgets will now be submitted to the Ministry of Education. As a result of increased revenues, Grand Erie's operating budget is approximately \$369 million, up \$13.8 million from last year's approved operating budget. This allows for key investments such as increased classroom supports, a strong focus on math and early literacy instruction, supports for student mental health and well-being, and continued renewal projects and upgrades to buildings and facilities to accommodate growing populations. Honouring National Indigenous Peoples Day

June 21 marked National Indigenous Peoples Day, an opportunity to celebrate and honour the diverse experiences, achievements and contributions of First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples, and a chance to learn from the histories, rights and realities that have shaped this country. In Grand Erie, more than 200 secondary students visited Ohsweken to mark the day, and many schools and staff members seized the opportunity to



enhance learners' knowledge and understanding of collective responsibilities and action.
