Annual Learning and Operating Plan Final Report

Grand Erie presented its **Annual Learning and Operating Plan**'s final report for the 2022-23 school year to trustees, highlighting progress made towards learning, well-being and belonging goals, and previewing work to come in the year ahead. The Annual Learning and Operating Plan is rooted in the Board's Multi-Year Strategic Plan, the five-year path that guides its work through the collective priorities of learning, well-being and belonging. The final report document charts specific learning goals and outcomes related to math and literacy, graduation rates, mental health and well-being, and the support services that help deliver on those goals.



New Learning, Well-Being and Belonging Goals for 2023-24 School Year

The Annual Learning and Operating Plan's final report closes the 2022-23 school year, and opens the new **Annual Learning and Operating Plan for the 2023-24 school year**, which was also presented to the Board on Monday. This plan builds on the solid momentum of the previous plan, identifying new targets for the responsive, equitable environments to nurture curiosity and opportunity for each learner.

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Truth and Reconciliation in Grand Erie

Schools across Grand Erie took part in important learning about our collective commitments to Truth and Reconciliation last month. Among the highlights was a football connection; the annual Every Child Matters game raised awareness and support while taking the field at Pauline Johnson Collegiate and Vocational School, playing McKinnon Park Secondary School. Pauline Johnson educator and coach – and former Hamilton Tiger-Cats player – John Macdonald was honoured the next day in Hamilton as his former CFL team recognized him as an alumnus of distinction. Macdonald, who is Mohawk, Wolf clan, originally from Six Nations of the Grand River Territory, has been a leader and an inspiration in Grand Erie since beginning his educational career here.
