This represents the best match of Census population data with elementary school enrolment. Children aged 0-9 in a census year make up the potential elementary school population four years later. i.e. children aged 0-9 in the 2001 Census would be aged 4 - 13 in the school year 2004-05 and make up the potential students for elementary enrolment

The total elementary enrolment for the Grand Erie area is compared to the total school aged population and expressed as a percentage of the total population.



French Immersion Enrolment September 2015 is 1,510 (an increase of 140% in 11 years)

### <u>Discussion of Options to Manage French Immersion Program Growth</u>

- Cap enrolment level of new registrations
  - Would require an approval process or lottery if requests exceed the number of available spaces
- Delay entry into the FI program until SK or Grade 1
  - Students would attend their home school for JK and SK.
- Modify or eliminate transportation provided for the FI program
  - Students would walk to their home school and/or group stops. This
    creates an inequity for rural students.

All three options may cause a shift in enrolment to the separate school system unless program admission and transportation policies are similar at both boards.



### <u>Discussion of Options to Manage French Immersion Program Growth</u>

- Expand available space for the FI Program
  - Ministry of Education has been clear that funding requests to create new pupil places for FI program growth would not be considered
- Retain Ecole Fairview once Coronation is complete
  - Total board enrolment has not increased to support an additional school
- Shift program space currently allocated to serve regular program to new FI program space.
  - While many schools have some surplus space available to assign to the FI
    program, few sites have a significant number of surplus spaces that could
    support a new FI program.

Regular program space would need to be displaced through boundary changes to open up an appropriate number of pupil spaces to commit to FI program.

### **Options for Community Consultation**

Grand Erie District School Board has reviewed the options for management of expansion of FI program and seeks community input on the following options:

- 1. Accelerate the implementation of FI program at Burford Elementary by adding grades 5 and 6 in September 2016 and complete the implementation with grades 7 and 8 added in September 2017. Beginning with September 2016, all Brant County resident FI students would be assigned to the FI program provided in Brant County
- 2. Implement a new dual track program at Branlyn for students residing in the Brier Park, Cedarland, Banbury and Branlyn school catchment area. The initial program would include JK to Grade 2 commencing September 2016 and be expanded in future years by adding one cohort per year.



### **Options for Community Consultation**

- 3. Amend the North Ward and Cobblestone Boundaries to include the current catchment area of Paris Central School and assign FI students from north Brant County to Paris Central making it a single track FI school effective September 2016.
- 4. Establish a second FI program at North Park or Pauline Johnson in September 2016





### **Options for consideration**

Accelerate the implementation of FI program at Burford Elementary by adding grades 5 and 6 in September 2016 and complete the implementation with grades 7 and 8 added in September 2017. Beginning with September 2016, all Brant County resident FI students would be assigned to the FI program provided in Brant County.

- 80 students are currently bused into the city of Brantford from Brant County to attend Dufferin and Fairview.
- If FI program were extended in Brant County enrolment pressure at Dufferin and Fairview would be eased.
- Grade 7 & 8 students from Brant County currently attending Dufferin and Fairview would be permitted to complete their elementary program at their current school.








### **Options for consideration**

Amend the North Ward and Cobblestone Boundaries to include the current catchment area of Paris Central School and assign FI students from north Brant County to Paris Central making it a single track FI school effective September 2016.

- An Accommodation Review has been initiated for the three Paris elementary schools to consider consolidation of Paris Central students into North Ward and Cobblestone schools.
- A new FI Program would be initiated at Paris Central as a JK to Grade 8 program serving students of Brant County.
- This would augment the program at Burford and provide 219 additional pupil places for the FI program.
- The Burford catchment would be defined to accommodate JK to Grade 4.
   Students from this area would attend Paris for Grades 5-8 FI programming.







### **Options for consideration**

Implement a new dual track program at Branlyn for students residing in the Brier Park, Cedarland, Banbury and Branlyn school catchment area. The initial program would include JK to Grade 2 commencing September 2016 and may be expanded in future years by adding one cohort per year.

- 97 students living in the proposed catchment area attend Dufferin and Fairview.
- If a new FI Program were added at Branlyn enrolment pressure at Dufferin and Fairview would be eased.
- Many of these students are within walking distance of Branlyn School.
- Accommodation at Branlyn would not support the expansion of the program Grade 8. Students from this area would attend Fairview for Grades 3-8 FI programming.

# Secondary Option approved by the Board for Community Consultation

 Establish a second FI program at North Park or Pauline Johnson in September 2016



## **Background Information**

- Schools may grant a certificate in French Immersion if the student has successfully completed the sequence of four courses in French Immersion and a minimum of six courses in other subjects taught in French.
- Currently BCI has 242 French Immersion students.
- Courses offered often depend on teacher's area(s) of specialization.
  - Currently BCI offers courses in French, Geography, History, Careers, Civics, and Drama
  - Recruitment and hiring for new program is sometimes challenging

- Values represent the sum of four cohorts prior to grade 9 (grades 5, 6, 7 and 8)
- These numbers do not include the students arriving from outside of Grand Erie or students who remain for a 5<sup>th</sup> year of secondary school
- Significant growth is noted when Burford students begin to graduate and transition to secondary school

# Current Enrolment and Percent Capacity Use of Schools

- Based on Ministry capacity ratings, BCI is at 107% capacity. It would be difficult to accommodate any additional FI growth.
- Both NPC and PJC have capacity ratings that would allow FI growth to be accommodated.
- Ministry rated capacity is being reviewed to ensure they are correct (example: classrooms where programs have 2 rooms such as special needs programs, or classrooms have been converted to fitness space).



## Implementation of a Second Site

### Considerations for implementation of new site:

- Defined catchment areas.
- Establish catchment with grandfathering.
- Transition one grade at a time to new site. This would reduce pressure at BCI. Students who transition would be determined by catchment area.
