### A Math Moment

# What can I do to support my child's math learning?

#### Be positive about math!

Avoid saying "I was never good at math" or "I never liked math." Show that you think math is important and interesting. Use numbers when you discuss daily activities, sports, and so on. Look for opportunities for math to be a natural part of your conversations.

#### Support for Problem Solving

If your child is struggling with a problem, remind your child that problem solving takes time. It also takes perseverance.

Use question prompts to help your child discover a solution. For example:

What information are you given? What are you asked to find?

What is happening in the problem? Can you draw a picture of the situation to help you solve it? What other ways could you represent the problem? (e.g. make a model, act it out, write a number sentence or equation, organize the data in a table, etc.)

What do you know by looking at the diagram?

What strategies have you used before that you might try here?

Is there another way you might have solved this problem?

Encourage your child to use problem-solving strategies he/she is learning in school. For example:

consider starting with the simplest part of the problem make a model or draw a diagram

make a table, chart or list

guess, check, and revise

look for a pattern

use a formula

work backward

#### Encourage your child to always check for accuracy of his/her work

By checking, your child will practice skills, build understanding, and become more self- reliant. Ask your child to explain why the solution is correct or incorrect

#### Talk aloud as you solve everyday problems of all kinds

Discuss alternate approaches and solutions with your child. Modelling how to solve a problem with your child will give your child more ideas and strategies.

#### What are "Number Talks"??

Number talks is a strategy teachers are using to help students understand that there are many ways to quickly solve problems.

- 1. Choose a number equation to solve. Example: 18 x 5
- 2. Have the whole family solve it in their heads, without using the traditional algorithm....give a thumbs up when you are done.
- 3. What was the answer ? (accept all as correct)
- 4. Explain your strategy (this will support the correct answer, or clarify errors made in strategy or calculation)
- 5. Compare strategies...perhaps use one of them for your next problem.

This strategy can be used at all grade levels and with the whole family....everyone will be amazed at how people approach problems in different ways! Give it a try with your family!
