SIP (School Improvement Plan)

We continue to work on our School Improvement Plan: Improving Mathematics Learning and

Achievement – Our strategies include using differentiated instruction and assessment, encouraging students to be actively engaged in mathematical thinking, developing greater understanding of mathematical concepts and strategies for more success in problem solving. Positive growth mindset for math learning is also a big focus.

<u>Promoting Safe Schools</u> – We are focusing on increasing students' positive sense of belonging at school and increasing respect for others. Some of our strategies include continuing to focus on our Character Traits and the Social Justice Begins with Me themes, establishing our Mental Health Wellness committee, including mental health wellness activities and discussions throughout the week, and using the MindUp resources and activities.

Growth Mindset

We have been working on increasing Growth Mindset in all aspects of school life. Mindset is a simple idea discovered by world-renowned Stanford University psychologist Carol Dweck in decades of research on achievement and success – a simple idea that makes all of the difference!

In a fixed mindset, the opposite of growth mindset, people believe that their basic qualities, like their intelligence or talent, are simply fixed traits. They spend their time documenting their intelligence or talent instead of developing them. They also believe that talent alone creates success – without effort. Carol Dweck's research shows that they (people with fixed mindset) are wrong!

In growth mindset, people believe that their most basic abilities can be developed through dedication and hard work – the intelligence and talents you are born with are just a starting point. This growth mindset view creates a love of learning and a resilience that is essential for great accomplishment.

Teaching and learning about Growth Mindset creates motivation and productivity in the world of business, education and sports. And it enhances relationships!

We are finding that our students are learning about the power of yet, e.g., I don't get it, yet. We learn from our mistakes and our hard work. They are learning that we can all learn, we all learn differently but we can all "get it!" This positive, growth mindset approach to learning is making a difference to our students' success and achievement and their belief in themselves.

<u>Ticks</u>

It seems that the seasonal and weather conditions this spring are perfect for ticks. We have heard of several incidents from our students and West Lynn families. Crossing Streets Before and After School: Using the Crossing Guard Safely

It may take a few minutes to wait, but safety should be the top priority. Children are always watching and listening to what the adults are doing. Thank you for your support with this important safety aspect.

Environmental Club

Our Environmental Club has been very active and innovative this year! The yard clean up for Earth Week was very successful in April. Also this spring the students had a battery drive to prevent the batteries from going into landfills. They collected 103 pounds of batteries, which was a ratio of 1:3 - pounds of batteries to students! The grade 8 class planted flowers in the front gardens with their grade 1 buddies. Another project was collecting milk bags and donating them to a group of quilters who shred them and weave them into thick mattresses for people in need in developing countries.

Our club has been working hard to qualify to officially become an EcoSchool this year. On Thurs. May 12 two representatives, one from the EcoSchools organization and Ms. Katie Hashimoto, Supervisor of Energy & Environmental Conservation for Grand Erie District School Board came to meet with the Environmental Club members to learn about all of the great environmental practices, events and projects we have done and are doing at West Lynn.
