Kindergarten

Students who will turn four by December 31, 2016 are eligible to register for junior kindergarten. Please register your child now, if you haven't already, rather than waiting until August, as we are now determining class sizes and teacher allocation for next September. If you know of anyone in your neighbourhood who has a kindergarten-age child, please pass this information along to them. A reminder that West Lynn has the Early Learning Kindergarten Program which runs all day, every day. This September again, there will be gradual entry for Kindergarten students. Current Junior Kindergarten students will attend school on the first day, Sept. 6. Kindergarten students who are new to West Lynn will start on different days of the first week back. Your child's start date will be communicated to you in advance of school startup in the fall.
