Today's Math Classroom

Students used to spend almost all their time working at their desks, with the teacher at the blackboard and with little discussion. Math classes today look, sound, and feel quite different.

How and Why it's Different?

If you peeked inside your child's math class, here are some things you would notice:

* students working on their own, in pairs, in small groups, independently and with teacher direction

* students engaged in a wide variety of tasks — practicing skills, solving problems about real-life situations, playing games, and applying math concepts to design challenges

* students using a variety of physical and digital learning tools as they explore math ideas and solve problems

* students using a variety of tools, including paper and pencil, chart paper and markers, and digital devices, to write and record their math thinking

* students talking about connections they have made personally or exploring new math concepts and skills

* students sharing their strategies for solving a problem

Learning math involves understanding concepts and procedures, acquiring skills, and applying math processes. Each of these aspects of learning requires different learning and teaching strategies. As well, individual students learn differently. It's important for students to have opportunities to learn in a variety of ways.

Cashless Schools- What is this?

We are very excited to announce the launch of School Cash Online, an online fee payment system that will allow parents to pay with credit cards for student hot lunches, milk, class trips etc. For teachers, staff and our volunteers, it will mean considerable time saved when planning, processing and handling cash payments. For parents, it will save time looking for proper change, going to an ATM, and most importantly, you can be assured that the money you have sent with your child has reached the proper destination. For example, the end of November saw separate bags/envelopes of money being brought to school for hot lunches, poinsettias and Crock A Doodle Pottery- with 3 different staff members or parent volunteers in charge of collecting, counting, and ordering these items. Errors can be made with so many people handling and processing the money. School Cash Online eliminates many steps. The money goes directly from the giver to the receiver.

Registered parents will receive notification when trips, hot lunches etc. become available for your children. This will help reduce the amount of overdue and forgotten payments.

Timelines

December-make parents aware of online fee payment and allow time for parents to register their child.

January - continue to make parents aware of online payment, and send out February's hot lunch order using online payment.

Orders are due by **January 16**th. You will receive notification for when the order is available.

A paper order will still be sent home this year as we transition to the online version for most school expenses.

Mrs. Pitre, our school secretary has used the online fee payment system at her previous school, so feel free to call her if you need help getting set up, or if you have specific questions about its use. You are welcome to come to the school to use a computer or tablet if your phone or home computer gives you grief! The Public Library has computers available for community use as well.
