When students are instructed, they will remain silent as they move away from the windows and door of the classroom, library or other space in the school where they happen to be. The teacher closes the curtains, locks the door and shuts off the lights to give the appearance of a vacant space.

A few school routines and safety reminders...

Thank you for having your children on the playground by 8:45am. This allows all students to line up and enter the school with their classmates as a regular routine. It also avoids interruptions to the classroom after the 8:50am bell.

Before your child leaves for school, please ensure that your child knows who is picking them up after school or how they are getting home. This will alleviate the stress on our students of not knowing who is coming to get them or how they are getting home. Writing a note in their agenda/communication book is the most efficient and safest way to ensure that your children go where they are supposed to go. It also minimizes disruptions in the classroom. We understand that emergencies arise and a call to the school is necessary. We appreciate your support in making arrangements before school and not calling the school to make these changes on a regular basis.

<u>Communication and Social Media in Our</u> <u>School Community</u>

Delivering education to children is very complex. Some aspects are decided by the Ministry of Education, some by the Grand Erie District School Board, some by the principal and some by the teacher.

Gaps and delays in communication and miscommunication can happen very easily.

When this does happen, **the easiest way to get more information is to ask your child's teacher (through a personal conversation, email or agenda/communication book)**. If the teacher cannot answer a question or is not in a position to solve the problem, the teacher or the parent can then talk to the principal who will try to solve the problem or get more information from the various departments within the Board of Education.

Social Media is a great place to share pictures and positive stories about/with family and friends. We love to see you engaged with the school community on Twitter, and Facebook. Throughout the year, you are encouraged to talk with teachers and Mrs. Black if you have a concern that you would like the school to know about so that we can help.
