#### <u>Waterford Public School Student Safety</u>

Like most schools, WPS has students in our school with severe food allergies (anaphylaxis) to a variety of food items, including peanuts and nuts. This is a medical condition that causes a severe reaction to specific foods. Prevention, of course, is the best approach. Although this may not affect your child's class directly, due to the likelihood of cross- contamination (from a hand to a drinking fountain, skipping rope, door handle etc), *I wanted you to be aware that sending foods that are free from peanuts or nut products can help reduce the risk* at school of a student having a life threatening reaction.

#### **Peanut-Free "Peanut Butter"**

There's a peanut-free soy nut butter product on the market that says it's a peanut butter substitute and safe for schools. Grand Erie District School Board requests that parents/guardians and staff refrain from bringing this product into our schools.

If it's peanut-free, then what's the big deal? This product looks, smells, and tastes like peanut butter. The concern is that some children might mistakenly think it is okay to bring peanut butter sandwiches in their lunches when they see their classmates eating the soy product. We simply cannot run the risk of any student being exposed to peanuts, as this may cause an allergic reaction. The safety and health of our students must come first.

# <u>School Begins at 8:50am</u>

Students who arrive to school after the bell rings at 8:50am are considered late. Although this may not seem problematic on an individual basis, consider the disruption to the classroom when the rest of the class is already settled at their desks and the teacher has started a new lesson. When a child arrives late, the focus of the students is momentarily lost (and this may happen 3-4 times depending on the number of students who are late in the class). The teacher then may then need to review the previously taught information to those who arrived late, or ask repeatedly for information in the agenda, assignments etc. Additionally, Mrs. Pitre our school secretary, is taken from her work to help younger students sign in and prepare late slips. Being punctual is a life long skill! **Set a goal to be on the playground by 8:45am** That way all students can line up when the bell rings and enter the school with all of their classmates.

# Students who have allergies or take medication

Asthma and allergies: If your child self administers a puffer for asthma, or if you require school personnel to administer medication at any time, it is board policy that a medical form be filled out. Please pick up a form at the office, which needs to be signed by your family doctor. This also allows classroom teachers to know who has a puffer so that we can monitor its use during the school day. In the case of Epi-pens, although some students may keep one in their backpack, a second Epi-pen is required to be kept at the office, so in the event of an emergency, all staff know to quickly access the office for the Epi-pen.

# **Bus Routines**

Waterford Public School continues to be a transfer point. This means that four busses arrive to Waterford PS at approximately 8:20am. Bus students will go to the playground where they will be supervised by a staff member. At the end of the day, busses will depart at approximately 3:25pm. Bus students will meet and be supervised on the playground during this time. The staff member will take students out to the busses once all four busses have arrived.

#### Special occasions at WPS

Teachers are always happy to have snacks and treats brought in for special occasions, however **only prepackaged foods purchased from grocery stores, bakeries, or other inspected and approved kitchen facilities are to be brought into schools**. Please keep treats and snacks in the original containers, boxes etc. if you are bringing in a treat or snack for a class. Please also keep in mind, that any items brought in must be peanut and nut free because of the chance of cross contamination for those students with severe life threatening allergies.

#### Accident Insurance Requirements for Students

Student accident coverage is recommended and voluntary for parents to consider for their child. It is important for parents to understand that the Board does not provide insurance for students against any accidental death, disability, dismemberment or medical expenses that might occur as a result of accident during school activities, including sporting events and field trips.

*Insure My Kids* protection plan is made available to parents, at low cost, to provide benefits for dental injuries and other accidents which may occur through participating in high-risk activities. In fact, there are options in the package for coverage outside of school hours including holidays and weekends. Please see the brochure for information or visit www.insuremykids.com.

Many parents may have accident coverage as part of their employer's benefit plan. It's important for parents to review their plans to make sure they have the necessary coverage for high-risk activities. Parents may want to consider purchasing additional personal coverage to reduce the anxiety associated from an injury to their child.

Grand Erie District School Board requires that all parents declare whether or not they have accident insurance. A declaration form is being sent home at the beginning of the school year for parent/guardian review and signature.
