SIGNING IN AND OUT

The Board of Education requires that all students who arrive at school late or leave the school early must sign in or out at the office. Parents who pick up their children during the school day for appointments must also sign their child out of the school. Parent volunteers, co-op students, maintenance workers and Board personnel are required to sign in and out. A Log Sheet is located in the office.

ATTENDANCE ROUTINES

Student Attendance is checked daily. Unless you, as the parent/guardian, have contacted the school to explain that your child will be late or absent, the school office is required to call to clarify this. For your convenience, an answering machine is attached to the school's incoming phone line and messages can be left during the evening and night to inform the school if your child will be absent. Please tell us your child's name, teacher AND a reason for the absence.

INCLEMENT WEATHER CONDITIONS

We watch the weather very closely here at North Ward School! If there is extreme weather, we make the decision to keep students indoors. This decision also includes in the morning before school starts. If the bell rings early please know that we have supervision in place for students, and you're kindly asked to drop your child(ren) off outside for them to be supervised by staff indoors.

We also believe in the importance of fresh air and exercise, students need to come dressed and prepared for all sorts of weather conditions, please ensure hats, gloves, mittens, boots, and extra socks are packed as the weather begins to get cool. Thank-you!

STUDENTS WITH HEALTH RISKS & NO NUTS POLICY

We are updating our files on students who, due to allergies, asthma or other conditions face significant health risks while at school. A number of students have precautions or require medications to be accessible for possible treatment and the school needs to be aware of their location and prescriptions. The Grand Erie District School Board requires that the appropriate medical forms be completed and kept on file at the school. Copies of these forms can be obtained at the office. Please be aware that school staff are not permitted to dispense medication to any child unless the appropriate forms are completed.

WE ARE A NUT AWARE SCHOOL Peanuts and all other nuts and nut products will cause life-threatening allergic reactions in some children in our school. For this reason, we ask that you please not send nut products of any kind to the school. Parents are asked to read product labels carefully. Please reinforce with your child(ren) the importance of not sharing or trading their food at school. The families of children with these allergies along with everyone at North Ward School thank you for your support throughout the school year.

Grand Erie District School Board: Focus on Equity in 2018-19


