If yes, how does this impact the community?

Many of the recreational activities would *not* be available to the community as Hagersville does not have a recreational centre to provide indoor space. Hagersville is also a growing community with 200 new houses slated to the west of the school. It is centrally located and in walking distance for these new developments.

Hagersville Secondary School is very important in terms of attracting families to the Hagersville area and in attracting developers who want to build new residential housing. Haldimand County invested over \$10 million dollars in upgrading the water treatment and sewage plant to provide capacity for development in the Hagersville area for years to come. Developers look for a hospital, which we have and schools, which we currently have. Land is available for development and servicing capacity is available so we would not want to lose a secondary school that is instrumental to attracting development.

Since 1892, Hagersville has been home to a secondary school. The original Hagersville High School was located just down the street from the existing Hagersville Community Centre and is now known as the Old High apartments.

The community greatly values the school as in many families, generations attended Hagersville Secondary School and there is a rich tradition. Many of our current teachers, themselves are Hagersville Alumni. It is noteworthy to add that Hagersville Secondary School has produced many professionals, athletes, and people who have been especially prominent in their career paths.

#### D. Other Value to the Local Economy?

The school in the local community has a considerable impact on local business, commerce, and has a significant influence on attracting local residential and commercial development. School staff make purchases in the community that they work, have their car serviced in the community that they work etc.. Students spend money in the local community on meals, school supplies, and other after school purchases. Additionally, programs offered at the schools make purchases from local businesses – a prime example is the amount of food purchased by HSS Crime Stoppers for their annual breakfast. All of those purchases are made locally. Supplies for Drama Club productions are also made locally whenever possible.

Secondary schools are crucial to the local community to attract residents, to provide employment and local commerce and to give the students a sense of being in their local community as they move beyond their education years. Haldimand County needs a trained workforce in each and every community, and we need our local secondary schools to keep our students supportive of, and be an integral part of our communities.
